EPISODE CONCEPT

6 Episodes, 6 couples, 12 weddings.

The Episode always starts at the headquarters of Roe Weddings as they await their meeting from the "client" (bride and groom) who are getting married that week. We then kick off with an introduction of the couple and take a look back at their relationship together. The episode is then broken down into three parts; last stage planning, first wedding and the second wedding. From the beginning to the end of the episode, we watch the couple transform to African royalty.

Throughout the episode, green screen interviews will interject of key characters (parents, couple, wedding planners, bridal party) who will bring the stories to life. At the end of the episode, the planners will sit together to look through social media posts of the weddings and determine its success.


